Location of ICOD (Situation):

ICOD is situated within Howrah District along the river Damodar and 50 km South West far of Kolkata. 20 km left from Uluberia Town, 3 km from Athanno (58) gates Bus Stop in a large eco-biological land expressing environmental respect, communication and harmony with the whole nature, plants, animals' earth, water & air.

Size:

The total land is comprised of 32 bighas up to the Very Damodar River. Two hectares or 4000000 Sq. feet (36000m) roughly 800m by 500m. There is a large Pond with an Island of 1500 sq. m and Similar smaller Ponds. We have also 20 clay and thatched roofed Bungalows shelter our inmates.

Aims & Objects:

- a. To offer all distressed, abandoned, lonely and orphan people a refuge for their life.
- b. To ensure & maintain Ecological Balance & sustainable Development.
- c. To involve the Poor, the marginalized minorities and women in the Socio-economic development intervention.
- d. To provide and arrange need-based training to the rural Folk, men & women, to upgrade their knowledge and improve their skill.
- e. To develop women empowerment, as equal with men at all levels of the community and all spheres of development for gender justice & equity.
- f. To identify and bring small groups, people's organization CBO and like-minded NGOs on a common platform to combat & arguing issues specially offering the poor people.
- g. To stop environmental degradation, and keeping a large island as eco-biodiversity preserve.
- h. To promote eco-friendly measures and scientific exploitation of natural resources.
- i. To build interreligious relationship for communal Harmony.
- j. To build inter human relationship for communal harmony.
- k. To build integrated network for global social interactions.

VISION

Strategy of Action:

Towards fulfillment of the avowed objectives, ICOD's strategy is to motivate people of the focused groups towards multi directions as well as integrated Community Development Interventions along with mobilise resources available with local Govt. & non-Govt. agencies, institutions and Departments.

Area of Operation:

As an outcome of ICOD is earlier efforts towards replication & explorations the project activities were continued covering all spheres of rural life at 5 identified villages of Shyampur Block-I of Howrah District, West Bengal.

Now we are going in details of the Programme:

1. Abandoned Women Welfare Expenses:

Abandoned, unprivileged and deprived women were provided shelter at Dalim Bhavan.

The mission of ICOD is to provide congenial atmosphere of living to the distressed unprivileged and abandoned women and mentally challenged women.

The women were provided with an opportunity to avail various types of Job-oriented training and engaged in multi-dimensional activities of ICOD so that they devote themselves wholly for work to ensure sound mental health

ICOD always envisages unique plan & programmes for more abandoned women so they look a new era of dimension for their betterment, prosperous & healthy lives.

2. Agro-Horticulture & Piscicluture:

The economic development of an emerging country like India is dependent on agriculture as well as formation of

agro-based food industry with good preservation facility.

About 70% of population's livelihood are dependent on agriculture. This agriculture, our solid pillar of living, stands on marginalized farmers who are facing great difficulty and threat due to worldwide industrialization, liberalization, non-planned usage of farming land for modern civilization. Not only that multi-national companies have been stressing importance on use of chemical fertilizer and pesticides for huge quantity of production for their large benefit which is harmful to land.

Gradual increase use of fertilizer & pesticides have been diminishing fertility of land as a result the Price of agricultural food has been increasing day by day and the farmers used to live under subsistence level due to hike in market price of fertilizer and pesticides. Being over burdened by debt, they have been sometimes obliged to commit suicide.

As an alternative method of cultivation, our ICOD has been stressing immense importance on the organic method of farming with bi-fertilizer & pesticides. As a result, me cost of production of crops will be minimized pollution problem caused by chemical fertilizer & pesticides will be reduced and the better way of living and sustainable development are to be ensured.

And last but not the least the fertility of land will be increased to a great extent.

We are in possession of 1500 sq. feet arable land for production of vegetables, fruits of different varieties and other crops of multi-dimensional purposes.

We allocated 5000 sq. feet fertilized land for production of several kinds of seasonal vegetables by using organic fertilizers and bio-pesticides.

We also allocated 300 sq. feet of land for production of different varieties of bananas including red ones from Kerala.

Moreover, there are scattered bamboo groves for practical use such as conducting repair works, bending of Bungalow, Pavilions, Pandals, boundary, Stafford's and furniture etc. one hundred co-coconut trees have been planted in this year under reports, accompanied some number of papayas.

There is a large number of flower gardens or flower beds scattered around the bungalows our nursery has more

than hundred plants shrubbery saplings and even orchids. The work planned flower gardens offer a heavenly beauty especially the great dahlias and gladioli garden in winter.

3. Animal Husbandry and Pisciculture:

a. Our ICOD has been stressing pivotal importance on the above cited programmes which are useful for accelerating income generation process with great care; we use to rear all kinds of poultry birds, such as geese, turkeys, guinea, fowl etc. We also stress importance on rearing, goats, pigs and sheep which is of paramount importance to be used as a source of permanent additional income.

Our dedicated ICOD has been always thinking to create a result oriented IGP which will be able to provide income facilities for a large number of people to provide.

b. Pisciculture plays a dominant role in income generation process. ICOD has a beautiful lake as pond with several islands where various types of fishes are being reared in several layers of water. Fish cultivation gives economic support to ICOD and meets the demands of unpolluted fish to ICOD inhabitants. In future we are planning to produce more fishes by taking some ponds in our locality by adopting organic method of rearing which will ensure pollution free environment.

4. Brick Field (AsharAlo) – Child Education:

Shyampur I & II Block are famous for manufacturing super quality bricks for strong longevity of building. There are about 50-60 brick fields where about 1500-2000 seasonal labours with their families come at the time of brick making in the winter season and left for his home in rainy season. The children of seasonal brick field workers are being deprived of formal education due to seasonal work system. With this objective in view, we run five special schools of child labourers at 10 brick fields out of the community contribution of well-wishers. Due to paucity of funds and despite our strong willing to do something for them, we could not arrange to spread education to the children of other brick fields.

So, we fervently request to yours good selves to extend technical, advisory & financial assistance towards the expansion of the programme.

5. **Dispensary Running**:

ICOD runs a charitable dispensary where the unprivileged and distressed men & women living under subsistence level are being treated and provided medicines at free of cost. This dispensary is being run under the proper supervision of qualified medical practitioners and dedicated social workers during the year under report, 1610 men and women are provided with free treatment facility.

6. Female Unit Running:

Female unit is situated at Malala Bhavan. It is a residential unit for mentally retarded and challenged girls and woman with associated physical disabilities are provided with multi-dimensional facilities such as, residence, adequate nutrition, meals and medical, educational, cultural & vocational aid to the inmates.

"ICOD" has been implementing this noble work with a view to offer a new aspiration & hope for their challenged lives since inception. We have marriages of s lot poor girls who have continued after to belong to our ICOD family and regularly come for birth delivery, illness, festivals whenever they fell the need to join us.

7. Male Unit Running (Dr. S. K. Sen Bhavan):

Male unit is situated at Dr. S. K. Sen Bhavan with four Bunglows where distressed & unprivileged male & boys are provided with residence, nutrition, food and other technical facilities for their better livelihood. Due to paucity of fund we are not in position to expand the program in view of devastating demand of the locality.

8. Mental Asylum:

This is situated at Mother Terresa Bhavan. Women suffering from various types of mental diseases such as dementia, emotional depression, suicidal tendencies, aggression, psychosis dependant, insanity etc. they are being treated well under close supervision of eminent psychiatrist.

Primary rehabilitation is done according to type of diseases. The best and more effective form is the higher positivity to go outside homes, walk under trees. To mix & play with other children will help them to overcome. Some among them are following training in sari, jori, bag, embroidery or handicraft.

9. Mushroom Cultivation:

Mushroom is nutritious food with multi-vitamins. With a view to provide nutritious food with mushroom to the inmates, we started mushroom cultivation and are able to produce adequate quantity of mushroom which is supplied to kitchen for cooking.

10. Sick Men unit Running:

There are old men including some adults physically & mentally ill rejected by their families. The very sick are followed daily by a physician. Besides no one wants to go to hospitals to die there. Occasionally, we are compelled to admit them at Uluberia Hospitals for treatment.

11. Social Welfare Programs:

We have conducted various types of social welfare programs with the help of our eminent social workers involving local people and community. Now, we are giving description of the programs in a nutshell.

a. Blood Donation Camp:

We organized a blood donation camp during the year under report in collaboration with Howrah Lion's club and uluberia sub-divisional hospital. 72 donors contributed their blood at this camp. It is no doubt a noble achievement because a drop of blood can ensure and save life of a dying patient. Very distinguished persons were present in this camp and exchange their valuable opinion.

b) Birth Day Celebration:

The birth day of great men such as Swami Vivekananda, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Rabindranath Tagore, Rishi Arabinda, Desbandhu Chittaranjan Das, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar and Mahatma Gandhi are celebrated with profound respect & due gravity by ICOD family members.

c) Biswakarma Puja:

We conducted the Puja Of God Biswakarma with due respect. A feast for all ICOD family members are arranged for this purpose.

d) Christmas Programme:

We celebrated the birthday of Jesus Christ with profound respect and due gravity on 25th December 2019 under the dynamic supervision of Beloved Brother Gaston Dayanand involving ICOD family members and community. For this, a universal prayer is being arranged at Divine Mercy Hall.

e) <u>Durga Puja</u>:

We celebrated the greatest Durga Puja, the main festival of all the Bengalese were celebrated with great respect with the direct participation of ICOD family members, community members. It is arranged to give pleasure & joy to the inmates of ICOD.

f) Easter Programme:

Easter Programme was celebrated with due respect with the active & direct participation of ICOD family members, inmates & community. An universal prayer was arranged at Divine Mercy Hall.

g) Independence Day Of Celebration:

We celebrated 72th Independence Day with profound respect. National flag were hoisted by Mrs Mamata Ghosh, our secretary in the auspicious presence of beloved brother Gaston Dayanand, staff members, inmates and some community members. ICOD surrounding was well decorated with the national flags. Mrs Mamata Ghosh delivered her precious speech in lucid manner and advised to safe guard & protect independence and integrity of India at any cost.

h) Kali Puja:

We conducted goddess kali with profound holistic respect with the help of eminent priest, our social workers with active participation of all the inmates. A feast on this occasion was arranged on immersion day.

i) Lakshmi Puja:

We also conducted Lakshmi Puja, Goddess of prosperity with profound respect with the help of an eminent priest and with the active participation of all the inmates. The objective of arranging puja is to give pleasure to the distressed and abandoned inmates.

j) Republic Day Celebration:

We celebrated 70th republic day with profound respect & honor and took an oath to protect the sovereignty of India at any cost and offered our great respect to Dr. B. B. Ambedkar the framer of Indian constitution.

12. Tailoring Scheme:

We arranged the above cited scheme for women inmates under the able guidance of a sewing teacher so that they may be self-reliant after completion of training.

13. Vocational Training:

We have four kinds of training

- i) Dance, Harmonium & Tabla (Bengali percussion instrument official sangeet Maya Academy " c/o Bangiyo Sahitya Parishad)
- ii) Embroidery on sari (jori craft) under this program one qualified lady teacher is the trainer. Sick girls are being trained.
- iii) Silk embroidery Mrs Tesiun Mondal, deaf and dumb lady is the trainer.
- iv) Original cord bag making.
